AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round-trip air transportation from the USA will be via economy class jet service aboard IATA & ARC carriers,utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable,non-amenable tickets for groups flying on the entire itinerary. International flight times will be confirmed to the travel agent at least 45 days prior to departure. Airline tickets must be finalized & issued a minimum of 30 days prior to departure. Once tickets are issued,they cannot be refunded or exchanged & subject to cancellation penalties. Your flight times are subject to change without advance notice. Priority Travel & Tours,Inc (hereafter PT&T) is not responsible for changes & delays in airline schedules, & does not reimburse passengers for expenses resulting from delays. **LUGGAGE:** Portage & handling of ONE piece of baggage per person is included. On airlines,the free baggage allowance is according to airline policy. Apart from the usual accessories (handbag,camera,etc.) each passenger on tour may have ONE piece of carry-one luggage. Airline liability for baggage is stated on contract included on all tickets & shall not exceed the actual loss,subject to proof. Baggage is at "Owner's Risk" throughout the tour offered from & return to US Departure City. DAY 01: USA/TEL AVIV.

Depart for Tel Aviv. (Meals in Flight)

DAY 02: TEL AVIV/

JERUSALEM Arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon arrival, transfer to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (D)

DAY 03: MOUNT OF OLIVES/

MOUNT ZION/BETHLEHEM

This morning we begin on the Mount of Olives for a panoramic view of Jerusalem. We visit the Chapel of the Ascension, Then we walk along Palm Sunday Road stopping at Dominus Flevit and the Garden of Gethsemane. Here we visit the Church of All Nations, which stands on the Rock of the Agony. View the Eastern (Golden) Gate and the Pinnacle of the Temple. Drive to Mount Zion and visit the House of Caiaphas, "The High

Priest," where Jesus was brought on the night He was arrested. We will visit the site of the Last Supper and the Tomb of David. We then proceed to Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus. We will visit the Church of the Nativity, Manger Square and Shepherd's Fields. We return to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 04: JERUSALEM/

BETHFAGE Today is a walking tour of the "Old City" of Jerusalem. We visit the Western Wall, walk through the excavations, and have a period of devotions on the southern steps to the temple area. We will see Mount Moriah and the Dome of the Rock, where tradition holds that Abraham took Isaac to be sacrificed. We then proceed to the Pool of Bethesda, the Chapel of the

Flagellation and Pilate's Judgment Hall. We will walk the Via Dolorosa, the Way of the Cross, passing through picturesque native bazaars to reach the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Next, we visit Bethfage, where Jesus mounted the donkey to begin His triumphal ride into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Our day ends at the Garden Tomb and Golgotha, (also known as Skull Hill). We return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

Day 05: QUMRAN/ DEAD SEA/

MASADA This morning we

drive down to Qumran, the site of the discovery of Dead Sea scrolls. We continue to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth. We'll stop briefly at the shores of the Dead Sea for a quick dip in the salt and mineral laden waters. Continue to Masada where we ascend by cable car to the top of this fortress built by King Herod, you can investigate the environs left by the community after their three year battle from 70-73 A.D. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 06: JERUSALEM /

BETHANY/ JERICHO/JORDAN

VALLEY/ TIBERIAS This morning we leave Jerusalem and drive to visit Bethany, the site where Mary, Martha and Lazarus lived and the tomb of Lazarus. We proceed through the Judean Wilderness and view the breath-taking Valley of Shadow of Death through the Jordan Valley to Jericho, the world's oldest inhabited city. We continue up the Jordan Valley to Tiberias in Galilee. We will stop at the tradition site of Baptism on the Jordan River then continue to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 07: AROUND THE SEA

OF GALILEE Today we start

by sailing on the Sea of Galilee. We will visit Capernaum, Jesus' second home. There we will see the second century Synagogue and the House of Peter's mother-in-law. We also visit Tabgha, the chapel dedicated to the multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes, the Mount of Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount. Then return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 08: NAZARETH/CANA.

After breakfast we depart Tiberias and proceed to Nazareth where we will see the Church of the Annunciation, Joseph's Workshop and Mary's Well. Then it is on to Cana where Jesus turned water into wine at a wedding feast. We return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 9: TIBERIAS/MOUNT

CARMEL/CAESAREA/

NETANYA After breakfast we

depart Tiberias. We view Mount Tabor and the historic military fortress of Megiddo that controlled the highway between Egypt and Mesopotamia as we make our way through the Valley of Armageddon. On to Haifa to see Mount Carmel and visit Elijah's Cave. We will drive south along the Mediterranean Sea and stop in Caesarea, the ancient port built by King Herod the Great. Then continue on to Netanya for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

DAY 10: NETANYA/TEL

AVIV/USA We leave Netanya

for Tel Aviv and our flight back home. We bring back with us memories of exciting and rewarding experiences in the Holy Land. This region will be more understood now as we read history, scripture and current events. (Meals in Flight)
